


Michigan Recreation Passport Revenue and Participation Trends


Motor Vehicle Permit and Recreation Passport Revenue*

* Prior to the development of the Recreation Passport system, Michigan's Motor Vehicle Permit program used a \$24 permit fee that residents were required to purchase independently in order to visit State Parks. On October 1, 2010, PA 35 of 2010 took effect, making FY 2010-2011 the first year to incorporate the State's shift to the Recreation Passport, giving Michigan drivers the option to pay a \$10 fee annually along with their vehicle registration. The convenience of the Recreation Passport Program has resulted in increased participation rates such that revenue has seen a significant increase despite the fee itself being lower relative to the \$24 Motor Vehicle Permit. This legislation included provisions for CPI adjustments to account for inflation.
