### Overview of State Appropriations for the Flint Drinking Water Emergency By Ellen Jeffries, Director

#### Background

The State of Michigan's Emergency Management Act (Public Act 390 of 1976) allows the Governor, by executive order or proclamation, to declare a state of emergency if the Governor determines that an emergency has occurred or that the threat of an emergency exists. On January 5, 2016, Governor Snyder issued a proclamation that a state of emergency existed in the County of Genesee and the City of Flint due to *"the damaged water infrastructure and leaching of lead into the city's water [that] caused damage to public and private water infrastructure, and has either caused or threatened to cause elevated blood lead levels, especially in the population of children and pregnant women, and [is] causing a potential immediate threat to public health and safety . . ."* (italics added).

The Emergency Management Act allows a Governor's declaration of a state of emergency to be in effect for 28 days. After 28 days, if a Governor wishes to extend the state of emergency, he or she must request an extension for a specific number of days, and such a request must be approved by a resolution of both houses of the Legislature. On January 28, 2016, the Senate and the House adopted Senate Concurrent Resolution (SCR) 23 to extend the state of emergency in Genesee County and the City of Flint through April 14, 2016, and on April 13, 2016, the Senate and the House adopted SCR 28 to further extend the state of emergency through August 14, 2016.

This article outlines the State appropriations enacted for fiscal year (FY) 2015-16 and FY 2016-17, in response to the Flint drinking water emergency situation.

#### Summary of State Appropriations for the Flint Drinking Water Emergency

Table 1 summarizes the estimated cumulative State appropriations enacted for the Flint drinking water declaration of emergency. As the table indicates, there have been five public acts that provided State appropriations for the Flint water emergency, totaling \$211.8 million in Gross appropriations for FY 2015-16 and \$74.7 million in Gross appropriations for FY 2016-17, with a cumulative Gross appropriation of \$286.4 million.

Table 6 (at the end of this article) lists the FY 2015-16 and FY 2016-17 enacted State appropriations for the Flint drinking water emergency by department or budget area. Of the \$286.4 million two-year cumulative Gross appropriation, the largest amount, \$51.8 million, is in the Department of Environmental Quality, followed closely by the \$51.2 million in the Department of Health and Human Services. It should be noted that the cumulative \$6.1 million appropriation for the Department of State Police does not include \$3.9 million that was spent in FY 2015-16 in Flint, or \$10.0 million that is potentially available in FY 2016-17, from the Disaster and Emergency Contingency Fund, since those dollars were not appropriated specifically for the Flint drinking water emergency.

**Details of State Appropriations for the Flint Drinking Water Emergency**

**Public Act 143 of 2015**

This FY 2015-16 supplemental appropriations act provided \$9.4 million of Gross appropriations, \$2.2 million of State restricted revenue, and \$7.2 million of General Fund/General Purpose (GF/GP) funding for three State departments. Table 2 summarizes the details of the Flint appropriations in the act.

**Public Act 3 of 2016**

There were FY 2015-16 State appropriations of \$28.0 million Gross, \$2.8 million Federal, \$2.6 million State restricted, and \$22.6 million GF/GP, for the Flint drinking water emergency in Public Act 3 of 2016. Six State departments received Flint appropriations in this supplemental act and those appropriations are summarized in Table 3.

**Public Act 24 of 2016**

This FY 2015-16 supplemental appropriations act included \$30.0 million of Gross appropriations, all from GF/GP revenue, to allow the Department of Treasury to reimburse the water enterprise fund of the City of Flint in an amount equal to credits posted to its customers' accounts related to the Flint drinking



water emergency. Residential water credits are restricted to no more than 65% of the amount billed between April 30, 2014, and the expiration of the emergency declaration, while nonresidential water credits are restricted to no more than 20% of the amount billed during that time period. The act prohibits reimbursement for sewer services, and requires credits to reflect rates paid at the time of billing.

**Public Act 249 of 2016**

Public Act 249 of 2016 is the Education Omnibus annual appropriation act for FY 2016-17 and includes appropriations for Community Colleges, Higher Education, and School Aid (K-12). The act also includes Education supplemental appropriations for FY 2015-16. There is an FY 2015-16 Flint supplemental appropriation of \$9.2 million Gross (all GF/GP revenue) for the K-12 budget that consists of \$8.3 million for Early On services and \$0.9 million for the Great Start Readiness Program, to provide services for children ages zero to four in the Flint area.

The FY 2016-17 annual K-12 budget includes \$10,142,600 of Gross appropriations (all GF/GP funding except for a \$100 reserve fund placeholder) for the Flint drinking water emergency. The FY 2015-16 and FY 2016-17 Flint K-12 appropriations are outlined in Table 4.

**Public Act 268 of 2016**

Public Act 268 of 2016 is the FY 2016-17 General Omnibus annual appropriation act for all budgets other than those in the Education Omnibus act, and also includes FY 2015-16 supplemental appropriations in Articles XX and XXI. The appropriations in Article XXI are FY 2015-16 supplemental appropriations, all of which are directed to the Flint drinking water emergency. Article XX includes one FY 2015-16 supplemental appropriation specifically directed to Flint's drinking water emergency: \$20.9 million Gross (\$4.5 million GF/GP) to reflect the Federal funds and State match for the Flint Medicaid waiver that allows more flexibility regarding income levels for the program. The FY 2015-16 Flint supplemental appropriations in Article XXI are for six State departments, totaling \$114.3 million of Gross appropriations and \$87.3 million of GF/GP appropriations. Section 901 of Article XXI creates the Drinking Water Declaration of Emergency Reserve Fund and specifies that funds may be spent only upon appropriation, or through the legislative transfer process. Part 1 of Article XXI includes an \$18.9 million appropriation in the Department of Technology, Management, and Budget, to the Fund. This allows these funds to be available for either a supplemental appropriation or a contingency fund transfer during FY 2016-17. Table 5 presents the FY 2015-16 and FY 2016-17 Flint drinking water emergency appropriations that are included in Public Act 268 of 2016.
