This transfer request provides increased GF/GP authorization to support survivor benefits to the families of public safety officers killed or totally and permanently disabled in the line of duty. The Public Safety Officer Benefit Program, established by PA 46 of 2004, is administrated through the Michigan Commission on Law Enforcement Standards (MCOLES), and provides for a one-time payment of \$25,000 for the care of a public safety officer permanently and totally disabled in the line of duty, or, in the event the public safety officer was killed in the line of duty, the spouse, children, or estate of the officer may be eligible for the one-time payment of \$25,000. Under the act, "Public safety officer" means an individual serving a public agency in an official capacity, with or without compensation, as a law enforcement officer, firefighter, rescue squad member, or ambulance crew member. "Law enforcement officer" means an individual involved in crime and juvenile delinquency control or reduction or the enforcement of the criminal law. It includes police, corrections, probation, parole, bailiffs, or other similar court officers. "Firefighter" means a volunteer or employed member of a fire department of a city, county, township, village, State university, community college, or a member of the Department of Natural Resources employed to fight fires.

MCOLES reports that with five payments of \$25,000 already authorized for payment to survivors for this year, and with another two benefit cases pending, the FY 2016-17 budget for benefit awards (\$125,000 GF/GP) would fall \$50,000 short, resulting in the potential delay of benefit payments until the next fiscal year.

The transfer request would provide \$50,000 to ensure the timely payment of benefits to these two additional potential recipients and provide another \$50,000 to cover, at a minimum, another two potential future eligible recipients for the remainder of FY 2016-17. Funding is available to support this request based on lease savings associated with the relocation of the State Emergency Operations Center to the new Michigan State Police Headquarters.
